Hello, and thank you so much for coming to our workshop production of *When It Comes*! I began writing this play two years ago as a way to help me make sense of the real-life experience my wife and I had in pursuing a dream that was dear to our hearts. We wanted to have a child. We spent 10 years, thousands of dollars, and hours upon hours trying to catch this dream. Our pursuit led me to ask the question: What does it cost to pursue a dream? How much are we willing to pay?

Once I received the Creative Catalyst Grant, I began to conduct interviews with various members of the San Diego community, asking them these questions: Tell me about a dream you had for yourself. Did you achieve it? If so, how did it change your life? If not, were you able to let it go and move forward? The answers I heard, woven together with what I know to be true, have resulted in the play you will see.

My intention with this play is to take my own personal story and, through the writing, find a way to make the story universal. My hope is that those who see the play will be affected by it, even though their own personal experiences might differ from mine.
